

Managing risk with floor surfaces

To encourage residents to participate in daily living activities, the risks associated with floor surfaces need to be considered, specifically in terms of maintenance and perception. What can you do to assist residents move confidently from one place to another?



Avoid strong complex patterns in floor coverings

Keep entrances/exits clear of contrasting mats

Tonally match flooring between dining and lounge areas

Provide good contrast between wall/skirting board and floor
